Dave Flannery's orchard utilizes Integrated Pest Management (IPM) techniques that includes using sound cultural practices, regular scouting for disease and insects, disruption of mating cycles, and encouraging beneficial insects and birds. The IPM techniques help reduce the number of sprays needed which both saves money and helps to protect the environment.
