life cycle / growth habit:perennial herb to 1 ft. tall

root:

tufts of slender, white roots from the nodes of the creeping stems



young plants



flower

stem:

stems creeping, whitish to often bright red, sometimes much branched

leaf:

opposite, oval, untoothed, to 1/2 in. long, with 3–5 red veins from the base

flower:

flowers small and inconspicuous, yellow-orange, with 5 petals; blooms July-September

fruit/seed:

pointed red pod, 1/4 in.
long, enclosed by the green
sepals, seeds several, tiny



flowering plants

habitat:

wet mud or sand on shores, in bogs, or growing in shallow water
